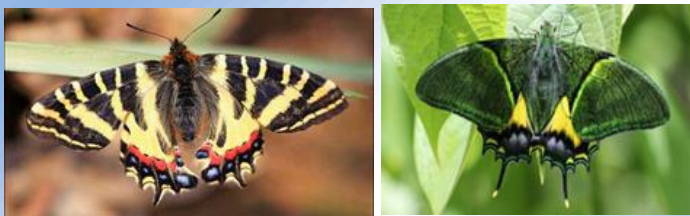

Biodiversity observation is an important basis for biodiversity conservation, and of great significance for understanding the status and changes of biodiversity, evaluating management effectiveness and formulating conservation measures.



In 2011, China initiated the construction of national biodiversity observation network. This network covers all biogeographic regions and four major biological groups (i.e. birds, amphibians, mammals, and butterflies). So far, a total of 749 sample regions have been set up, with 11,887 line transects and point transects.



At this side-event, we will present an overview of China Biodiversity Observation Network, and further introduce the observation methods used, work progress and preliminary results up to now.
